The United States is in mental health crisis

1/5 adults experienced symptoms of anxiety and depression in 2023¹

2/5 high school students reported struggling with persistent sadness and hopelessness in 2023²

5.8 million emergency department visits occurred in 2021 with mental, behavioral, and neurodevelopmental disorders as the primary diagnosis³

Deaths from drugs, alcohol, and suicide more than doubled from 2000 to 2017⁴

Suicide is the second leading cause of death for youth and young adults (ages 10-24)⁵

Likely Underestimate


- Draws on current use of behavioral health services to estimate need.

Psychologists seeing changes in their workloads in the last 12 months, 2024







Ethical and equitable use of AI/technology




Demographic Cliff


 Sharp drop in birth rates following great recession














Community College: An Overlooked Segment

- Serve about 10 million students per year
 - 44% of all undergraduates
- Affordable and accessible (rural, suburban, and urban areas)
 - Provide broad access to higher education
- Entry point for many first-generation, lowincome, Black, and Hispanic students
 - 51% of all Hispanic undergraduates
 - 40% of all Black undergraduates






Psychology Educators from 2-Year Colleges in Disciplinary Societies: Promoting Equitable Educational Outcomes and Broadening the Pathway into Psychology

- (1) Identify effective outreach strategies
- (2) Explore unique professional needs of psychology educators at 2YC, uncover barriers to participation, and brainstorm methods of creating a more inclusive community in which educator needs are met;
- (3) Begin to develop a network of educators at 2-year colleges who can catalyze change at their institutions, in their local regions, and within the discipline; and
- (4) Provide a transformational professional development experience

Increase the Role of Psychologists in the Teaching of High School Psychology

- 38 states do not require credentials to teach high school psychology
- Most states have not adopted APAs National Standards for High School Psychology curricula.
- Most students earning psychology credit take an on-level course
 - On-level teachers do not have the same access to professional development opportunities and course guidance as AP and IB teachers





The Current Practice Landscape

Practicing with a Master's Degree in Psychology

- 19 states currently license/ register master's degree psychology professionals
 - No guidance from APA; Little consistency in licensing/regulations
- Historically many students from master's in psychology programs sought licensure under LPC/LMHC
 - Increasing restrictions on LPC/LMHC to this path
- Psychology's minimal focus on master's degree education and practice limits our impact on the field.
